Goals vs. Dreams

Dream small dreams. If you make them too big, you get overwhelmed and you don't do anything. If you make small goals and accomplish them, it gives you the confidence to go on to higher goals.

Why should we goal set in the first place? In my opinion, setting a goal helps you figure out a training agenda to prepare for a show or even improve in class.

There's a big difference between a goal and a dream. They aren't necessarily interchangeable. My dream would be to win the Westminster Masters Agility Championship, but that is not realistically going to happen. Another dream would be for Fenway to keep his startline stay and earn a Q. I'm not putting either in my Goal Column. Both are unlikely because I will be super emotional, nervous and have an excitable dog. Instead, I'm going to focus on my goal of having total connection with Fenway—especially after the Tunnel exits. Since he's an experienced dog, it's been easy for me to take for granted that he will go where the path seems obvious. Not so! At 11 1/2, I'm learning that I need to handle him a lot differently and give him much more SUPPORT—his eyes are not what they used to be.

Connection is a realistic goal and I am enthusiastically working on it. There are things I *can do* and to make this happen. We are going to classes, privates and seminars to practice a new handling style so that it becomes a habit. Now, I'm looking forward to Westminster instead of dreading it—because I've targeted a goal that's realistically possible.

Goals don't entail luck—like dreams. The trick is to figure out a 100% realistic goal. Your expectations will be based on reality—not a dream that will most likely never happen without a miracle or magic wand.

While you are working on a goal, it's perfectly okay to back down on expectations while you are working on it. Start small. Figure out a game plan. Train it piece by piece. Know it. Live it. Be proud of your new skill!

Friends,

Welcome to winter! Just a few items for reminders: Club house closings and class cancellations follow Montgomery County schools. If schools are closed, so is the club house and consequently there are no classes. If schools open late, you should contact your instructor to see if class will be help.

Your friendly and faithful President will endeavor to keep snow and ice away from the front door. However, even I get snowed in sometimes, so you should be mindful when coming in after a “weather event.”

I have had questions about the water dispenser. Here are your answers: The dispenser that we had for several years was costing us over \$400 per year. Your Board of Directors decided to replace it with a purchased one that will cost, after purchase, less than \$50 per year! That expense represents a yearly filter replacement. The new dispenser should arrive on Friday, February 1 and will be installed shortly thereafter.

Please remember to pick up after your dogs and take away the evidence! **Please know that failure to do this is grounds for expulsion.** (YES!) There have been instances recently of members arriving in the morning to find that lights have been left on all night, the bathroom fan left on (a fire hazard!) and the door to the equipment room left open. The last person to leave the building each evening is responsible to: return heater thermostats to 60 degrees in winter, and air conditioner thermostat to 78-80 degrees in summer, turn off the interior lights, and to make sure the equipment room door is shut. *The last person to leave must be a key holder!* The upper most light switch is for the exterior security light. That switch remains in the “ON” position because the security light operates on a sensor that automatically turns the light on and off when the sun sets and rises.

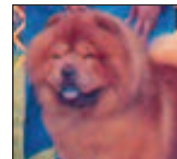

Delegates Corner

In the Companion Events Committee Meeting

- As I mentioned at our meeting, AKC staff is proposing 3 types of incentives to retain teams completing at the OTCH level in Obedience.

Everyone is aware we are not seeing the number of OTCH's anymore. The Committee is proposing adjusting the Number Of Dogs competing requirements by decreasing the Number Of Dogs by one. Add one point to second and third place where it is currently zero points and add one point for 4th place for classes that have 20-29 dogs competing.

Secondly, they are proposing to add one point for a score of 195 or better when the dog does not earn points from the top four placements in the Open B and Utility B.

Finally, they are proposing to provide title recognition by adding a numeric designation to the title and recognition for exhibitors who have earned the OTCH title but want to continue competing with their dogs. This can be done by recognizing the number of times a dog has achieved the OTCH title requirement *e.g.* *OTCH2*. This is consistent with other Companion Events of agility, rally and tracking. Hopefully, this would encourage exhibitors to remain engaged in the sport of obedience.

- There will be recommendations for changes in Tracking to address issues and questions that have been raised by the tracking community regarding participation in the sport. None of the recommendations change the substance of the test. For more specifics, contact me if interested.
- The 2019 Agility Advisory Committee received over 3000 recommendations and comments from the fancy. They met Nov. 5-7 in Raleigh, NC. The Committee's first step is to send a survey to the fancy on changes that affect them.
- For AKC Fit Dog Club, it was suggested that clubs have "club walks". This could be a great

public outreach for a club in the community. Clubs having four walking events a year will be sent a banner.

- RACH Title changes were made in February and the information is on website.

In the General Meeting:

- The Delegates passed the 1 plus 1 Amendment and I voted in favor as directed by the CDTC Board. Therefore, Best of Winners (BW) in Conformation will now receive 1 point as of January 1, 2019.
- Candidates for the AKC Board spoke and you can go to the website to review their bios. Any member who wants to discuss a candidate with me can send me an email.
- The AKC Museum of the Dog Opening will be February 8 during Westminster weekend. I understand admission for adults will be \$15 and a there will be a lower fee for children. Let me again personally THANK members who have supported my efforts for the Club Museum Plaque. With the Spa Raffle, Holiday Baskets, Westminster Raffle and a couple of private donations, we have raised about \$1500—over halfway to our goal! If anyone has any fundraising ideas that will help raise the remaining \$1000, feel free to contact me so I can discuss them with our Board.
- This is a short summary because of our abbreviated newsletter. Thanks to Pam Coblyn for your hard work and assisting me with my Delegates reports and graphic information ads over the years.

New Rally Title and More!

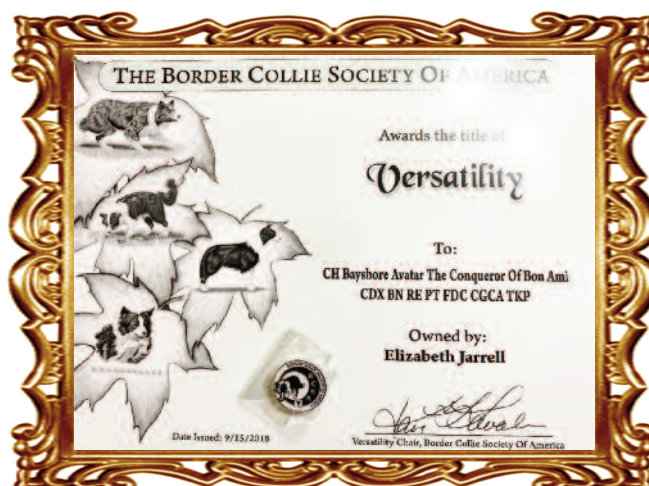

New Book by CDTC Obedience Instructor Joan Adler!


Joan T. Adler's experience with dogs as a child was limited. So much so, that when her daughter wanted a dog, Joan said that the dog should be named "Mommy," because she would no longer be living there. Fast forward to 1975. The family decided to get a Dalmatian, and the rest is history. Joan began obedience training immediately, and started teaching obedience in 1977. Since that time, she has read extensively on the topic, attended countless seminars, and switched breeds to German Shepherds. She now lives in Maryland with her husband and beloved service dog.

After deciding what you want to do with your dog, you need to figure out how to explain/train it to the dog. You will teach by showing, helping, rewarding, and giving feedback to the dog. After organizing a plan and following the principles listed, you can apply most of the popular training methods. You will learn how to introduce training "aids" and use distractions to help the dog have a clear understanding of what you are asking her to do. Several step-by-step training progressions are included.

Obedience—Did You Know?

Judge's Orders: Command Discrimination, from AKC Companion Events Department

The orders are: "Leave your dog" and "Back to your dog." The judge must use signals for directing the handler to command and/or signal the dog to change position except for the first position and that order is: "Stand your dog" or "Down your dog."

The procedure is clearly explained in the Obedience Regulations.

DO NOT USE VERBAL ORDERS for position changes after the first initial position change, which is given when the handler is standing with the dog sitting in heel position. When the handler is in front and away from the dog, your verbal order greatly increases the dog's chance of responding to you, which is often times the same verbal command the exhibitor uses, which then results in a non-qualifying score.

New Classes & Groups At CDTC!

Is your dog anxious or somewhat wild in the presence of other dogs or strange people? Lisa Daniel is teaching a **Calming Class** that started on Saturday, January 26 and runs from 4-5 pm. If your dog needs help and you didn't enroll in the class, Lisa will hold a Calming Training Group starting on March 1. It will run from 4-5 pm. The classes are based on the work of Mark McCabe. This class is for helping dogs relax and behave better by actually shifting their emotions to be less anxious and more calm. Dogs need to be able to be crated (vision can be blocked if needed) without excessive barking because sometimes only one dog may be worked at a time.

Once you register, you should receive a confirmation email to the email address you registered with and the password you registered. Once you receive your password, you will access the site at the usual address (www.cdtc.org). In the upper left of the main page is a **Login Button**—or you can go directly to <http://cdtc.org/login-3/>. You should see a form where you will be asked to fill in your email address and password. Fill in both fields and click to login. I have found that it tells me that I have logged in successfully right away and takes me directly to the Members Only page. The usual documents that we have displayed in the past will appear on that page, including the Membership Roster, Bylaws and P&P.


